WINDING DOWN WHN

With new leaves emerging on our native trees in the nursery and in the woods, we have finished digging for the final time, and we still have a limited number of native trees remaining available for this fall.

Spring is a time of renewal and this spring brings a new direction for White House Natives. We have been growing native trees along the Shenandoah River since our humble beginning over 15 years ago, with a modest planting of 1,000 trees. We quickly ramped up production to several thousand trees annually and hired Eric to manage the nursery. We have had our challenges with a derecho that leveled the nursery in our first year, as well as dry autumns and wet springs, making planting and digging difficult. We have also had many success stories and cherished memories of team members and days spent in the field in one of the most beautiful settings in Virginia.

As we alluded to in our last email, we have decided to wrap up major operations at White House Natives this spring. All confirmed orders will be shipped as scheduled. Eric and I will be available to answer any questions and Debbie will be handling our accounting through June. We do, however, still have a couple of thousand native trees in the ground that are pruned and spaced and could use a forever home in your future landscape projects. Operations will be very limited, but we would like to help find these native trees a home.

The good news is Eric is staying with the farm to help manage its operations and taking on a more significant role with the White House Farm Foundation. He will have his hands full and will still be close to these remaining trees. One of our goals was to be an exclusively native tree nursery and an excellent steward of the land, which was key to producing an abundance of native trees that now enhance landscapes throughout the mid-Atlantic region. We also have had the opportunity to meet numerous people as customers, advocates, or just a helping hand. We would like to extend a special thank-you to Bernie and his digging team, who have helped us with extra hands, equipment, and expertise over the past decade.

Also, we owe a debt of gratitude to our industry partner and friends, Tim and Noel at Spring Hill Nursery. They have been an asset, sharing their wealth of knowledge and always willing to help out.

It has been our pleasure to be a small part of this great industry, and we appreciate your understanding as we wind down operations and wish you all the best of luck in your future endeavors.
