### **WE ARE DIGGING!**

Cooler weather and shorter days have prompted our native trees to start to shut down for the year and begin their spectacular display of fall color, signaling it is now safe to dig. We have started digging numerous trees the past ten days in order to have material ready for customers that need their trees early. Normally, we would like to see more leaf drop before digging, but in order to accommodate our customers and their job schedules, we started prepping and digging early this fall. Eric has taken extra precautions to

make sure all trees being dug are hydrated before digging with additional drip irrigation and immediately afterward in our staging area with overhead irrigation to ensure a successful fall transplanting.

Eric is even busier than normal, coordinating all the digging, tagging, customer pickups, and loading delivery trucks. Our availability is changing daily, and we are doing our best to get major updates on our online availability weekly. Please click on the link below to see what is still available. If you have special requests for a specific item or large quantity, please contact Eric directly, and he can guide you to what is available and when he can have your trees ready.

In addition to taking more orders for smaller trees (+- 1½”), we do have a handful of larger (3-4”) willow, pin and bur oaks available. If you need a native oak with instant impact, contact Eric and he can tag and dig them for you if you don’t have time to come out to the nursery.

Thank you for all the wonderful fall orders and helping to promote WHN and the value of locally-grown native trees. It is always a pleasure to see the native trees we have cultivated for the past few years head to their forever homes all over the mid-Atlantic area.

## NATIVE OF THE MONTH: *Betula nigra*



***Betula nigra*, the river birch, is a fast-growing and versatile native shade and ornamental tree.** Indigenous to the eastern United States, from coastal New Hampshire west to Minnesota and south to eastern Texas and northern Florida, river birch prefers swampy areas, bottomlands and stream banks in its native range. It can grow as a single-stemmed specimen or as a multi-trunked clump. Pyramidal in form when young, it develops a rounded irregular crown when mature, topping out at 40 to 70 feet in height.
